Background:

The Board of Education believes that a limited number of students over the age of 22 may be admitted into high school academic programs. Furthermore, the Board of Education believes that adult students can be outstanding role models for younger students. Their presence and work can affirm the importance of education. Admission may occur after a thorough review of each individual request by the principal.

POLICY:

Each high school principal may accept students, age 22 years or older, in accordance with the board guidelines, procedures and regulations.

Guidelines:

- 1. The high school principal may consult with staff members and other appropriate persons (pastors; Catholic Education Centre Administrators) before making a final decision.
- The principal shall judge the effect the presence of the adult learner may have in each class and within the school before admitting the learner.
- 3. The principal shall develop school administrative procedures that must be approved by the Director of Education.
- 4. If the number of requests from students over 22 exceeds three in any given school year the fiscal implications will be reported to the Director and Board of Education for consideration.
- 5. Student access to other programs available through other educational institutions, such as Adult Ed programs or upgrading programs will be considered.

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
